# The Present Simple Tense

#### Used to talk about:

```
* everyday activities
```

- \* habits and routines
- \* permanent situations
- \* likes and dislikes
- \* scheduled events
- \* verbs expressing possession,

senses,

emotions, and mental

activities.





# **The Present Simple Tense**

### Positive:

Subject + Verb + Indirect Object + Direct Object + How + Where + When

## Negative (except modal verbs and To be):

Subject + DO/DOES + NOT + Verb (bare Infinitive) + Indirect Object + Direct Object + How + Where + When





## Adverbs of frequency

Used to express how often an action occurs.

- ♦ always
- ♦ usually
- ♦ often
- ♦ sometimes
- ♦ never

Position:

Before the main verb

Paco never drinks alcohol

After the verb "to be"

You are always goofing off





## Other ways to express frequency

#### other adverbs

- $\Rightarrow$  once, twice...
- ⇒ daily, weekly, monthly, yearly...
- ⇒ constantly, continuously...

## adverbial phrases

⇒ once, twice, three times a

day/week...

 $\Rightarrow$  every

morning/afternoon/day/week...

- ⇒ on Mondays/weekdays/weekends...
- ⇒ from time to time, again and again...

## **Wordformation: Adverbs**

#### Form:

```
Adding suffix –ly to the adjective:

short → shortly

complete → completely

happy → happily
```

Not all words ending in –ly are adverbs: *costly*, *lovely*, or *friendly*, for example, are not adverbs but adjectives.

#### Types of adverbs:

- \* Frequency: always, usually, often...
- \* Manner: well, quickly, badly, happily...
- \* Time: today, tomorrow, in June, next month, last year...
- \* Place: here, there, everywhere, somewhere...
- \* Degree or completeness: almost, completely...
- \* Certainty: certainly, obviously, perhaps...
- \* Comment and viewpoint: clearly, presumably, surely...
