



# Paco: Paco is wearing a new suit





## **The Present Continuous Tense**

#### Positive:

Subject + Present "to be" + Present Participle (-ing)

### Negative:

Subject + Present "to be" + NOT + Present Participle (-ing)





### **The Present Continuous Tense**

#### Used to talk about:

- \* actions happening at the moment of speaking.
  - Paco is wearing a new suit.
- \* actions happening in a period around the present moment in time.
  - Thomas's cousin is staying with them these days.
- \* future plans and arrangements.
  - Andrés is meeting Paco next Saturday evening.
- \* trends or changes.
  - Paco thinks English is becoming harder and harder.
- \* repeated actions which are irritating to the speaker.
  - "Sonia, you're always speaking on the phone", said Paco.





# Stative vs. dynamic verbs

#### Stative verbs

- \* describe a state or condition rather than an action
- \* are not used in continuous tenses

have (possession), know, like, understand...

#### Dynamic verbs

- \* describe actions
- \* can be used in continuous tenses

have (take), go, write, play...





# Present Simple vs. Present Continuous

#### **Present Simple**

habits / routines

likes, dislikes

permanent situations /

repeated actions

scheduled events

things which are always or generally true

#### **Present Continuous**

actions happening at the moment of speaking

temporary or developing actions

trends or changes

future plans or arrangements

complains (always, constantly...)

#### <u>Third person singular –s:</u>

Voiced sound + (e)s: /z/ (voiced) e.g. knows

Voiceless sound + (e)s: /s/ (voiceless) e.g. starts

/s/, sh /ʃ/, ch /tʃ/, /z/, /dʒ/ + -es: **/iz/ e.g. washes** 





# Spanish vs. English

#### Sometimes actions occurring at the moment of speaking:

<u>Spanish</u>: Presente de indicativo (*Lleva un traje nuevo*)

**English**: Present Continuous or Progressive (*He is wearing a new suit*)

#### **Future plans or arrangements:**

<u>Spanish</u>: Futuro simple / Presente de indicativo (*Mañana me reúno con el Director del banco*).

English: Present Continuous (I'm meeting the bank manager tomorrow).
