Paco has been waiting for a taxi Structure: S + have/has + been + Gerund

What have you been doing so far? I have been visiting England. I have been learning English lately. I have been practising as much as possible. I have been reading some leaflets.

Paco plans to visit Edinburgh Structure: S + verb + TO + verb

Paco has **planned to** visit Edinburgh. He **decided to** go to the tourist information office. He **wants to** visit the famous castle. He **would like to** try some typical food. The woman **seems to** be very helpful. Paco mustn't **forget to** ask for a city map. He **needs to** queue up a bit. He **hopes to** have a great day!
