Modal verbs: form

Paco can communicate in Canada

Structure: modal verb + infinitive

Paco **can** communicate with Canadian people without any problem; All laws **must** be enacted in English and French; Paco **might** go up to the north and visit Nunavut; Paco **could** meet some Inuit people there; He **should** buy some warmer clothes.





Modal verbs: meaning

Paco might visit the north

All laws **must** be enacted in English and French (obligation).

It must be freezing in the Arctic! (deduction).

Paco might visit Nunavut (possibility).

Paco could meet some Inuit people there (possibility).

You **mustn't** smoke in this room (prohibition).

May I open the door? (permission)

You should study more (advice).

Paco can speak English (ability).

Etc.





Defining relative clauses

Canada is the country that Paco chose to visit next

- The Dutch Royal Family are the people **who** sent tulips as a present (people).
- The Peace Tower is a national symbol **which** is part of the Parliament Buildings (things).
- The high humidity is an issue **that** irritates people in Ottawa (people or things).





Reported speech: statements

John said that there were many attractions

Reporting what other people said

- He told them that there were many attractions for people interested in history.
- He said that it would be a unique experience.
- He told them that this attraction came from the Netherlands.
- He said that it had started in 1945.





Reported speech: commands

Reporting what other people said

- John advised them to see the Rideau Canal.
- The guide also recommended them not to miss the Canadian Tulip Festival.
