SUBJECT + TO BE + VERB -ING

Used for future arrangements.

What are you visiting these days?

I'm visiting the main Dublin attractions.

I'm celebrating St. Patrick's Day.

I'm trying a true Guinness.

I'm checking the bus timetables.



The future: Present Simple

What time does the bus leave?

- A programme or timetable.

-What time does the bus leave?

-It leaves at 10.30.

Too / enough

It's too late

Get on: enter

Get around: travel, go from place to place

Get out: take out

Get good at: become more and more skillful at something

Get off: leave the train or bus

Get along with: have a good relationship

Get over: recover

Get down to business: start giving serious attention

Get a hold of someone: contact

Get across: communicate
