The past tenses: form

The plane has just taken off.

Structure: Subject + have/has + past participle

He visited the museum two days ago.

Structure: Subject + verb in the past (-ed or second column)

Paco had heard that song before.

Structure: Subject + had + past participle

Paco has been thinking about his adventures.

Structure: Subject + have/has + been + verb -ing







The past tenses: use

Present Perfect Simple:

Experiences, connection with the present and with the past; the results are more important.

Present Perfect Continuous:

Similar; the activity is more important.

Past Simple:

For completed actions in the past.

Past Perfect:

Earlier action than the Past Simple.







Modal verbs

You must show me your passport

- The landing has been much better so the book **must** be really good.
- Do I **need** to leave the key? No, you **needn't**.
- You **mustn't** smoke in your room.
- You **must** be respectful.
- You have to leave by 12 o'clock.







Collocations

Words that naturally go together:

- Go by bus.
- Get on a bus.
- Get off a bus.
- Wait for the bus.
- Miss the bus.
- *Lose the bus. (not possible)







The passive voice

A murder has been committed

- A murder had been committed the night before.
- The culprit has already been arrested.
- Everything was filmed.
- The man **was found** driving at high speed.
- He will be interrogated in the morning.
