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Past Perfect: Form

PAST OF "TO HAVE" ("had")

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PAST PARTICIPLE

- regular verbs: -ed

- irregular verbs: 3rd column

Affirmative	Negative	Interrogative
Paco had left everything in order.	He had not (hadn't) left everything in order.	Had he left everything in order?
Paco had asked her to come.	Paco had not (hadn't) asked her to come.	Had Paco asked her to come?





Past Perfect: Use

Past Perfect	 Completed action before something in 	Paco had already seen Blood Diamonds before he left for England.
t	the past: – Another action in	Sonia had given Paco a book of short stories before he flew to England.
	the Past Simple. – A complement of time indicating the past.	By the time he went to bed, he had listened to that song three times.
		By 2006, Andrés had already broken Paco's tennis racket.






The Passive Voice:Form and uses To be + Past Participle

A newspaper <u>was left</u> on the bedside table.

It <u>is said</u> children begin to work at an early age. Main uses:

• The receiver of the action is more important than the doer or performer

Paco was not given a convincing explanation at the diamond mine (by the soldier).

• The doer or performer of the action is unknown or unimportant.

Paco has never been told the truth.

• The doer or performer of an action is too obvious to be worth mentioning.

Nelson Mandela was given the Nobel Peace Prize in





The Passive Voice: Other uses

• To conceal the performer of an action or the identity of a person responsible for a mistake.

Andrés's tennis racket has been broken.

• To emphasize the doer or performer of an action.

In 1993, the Nobel Peace Prize was given to Nelson Mandela, who had fought to achieve multi-racial democracy in South Africa.

Passive sense:

1. To have something done

Paco's parents had their house painted.

2. Need + gerund

Paco's parents' house needs painting.
